Position Description:

The Department of Transportation currently anticipates numerous Engineer Intern opportunities available in several Bureaus'. These are full-time positions within the Engineering, Scientific, and Technical Bargaining Unit in salary group ES-18. Upon passing the State examination for Transportation Engineer 1, and with acceptable job performance, the selected candidate will qualify to be promoted to the classification of Transportation Engineer 1 in salary group ES-20 (see "Special Requirement" below for details).

Examples of Duties:

Performs a wide variety of increasingly difficult duties as technical skills are acquired during course of training period.

Knowledge, Skill, and Ability Requirements:

General knowledge of basic engineering theories, principles and methods; skill in use of drafting and calculating instruments; considerable ability in performing mathematical computations, making neat and accurate drawings and preparing minor design and structural details.

Experience and Training Requirements:

A Bachelor's degree in EITHER civil engineering or industrial technology with a specialty in construction OR engineering.

Special Requirement:

Appointment to this class shall be for a period of not more than two (2) years or until the promulgation of an eligible list from the first examination announced by the State Personnel Division one (1) year after date of appointment for a class for which incumbent qualifies from on-the-job training.

Eligibility:

In order to be considered for this position, candidates must possess a Bachelor's degree in EITHER civil engineering or industrial technology with a specialty in construction OR engineering. State employees currently holding the title of Engineer Intern may apply for lateral transfer.

Those selected through the interview process receive technical on-the-job training to develop their professional engineering skills for advancement within the Department. Our engineers are encouraged to obtain licensure as a Professional Engineer.

College students who will meet the experience and training requirements by the end of the Spring 2008 semester are encouraged to apply.
